later on Thursday 23rd November the dream became a reality and the deal was finally completed so it is now club property.

There has been a few hiccups along the way, initially the vendor pulled out when he realised it was the club who had put in an offer, although within the week his mind had been changed. The sale was then held up because the vendor didn't actually have the title to sell the property as it was still in probate (as some of you may know this can take forever). On top of this the bank with whom we have taken out a loan to purchase the property wanted various requirements such as valuation of the club house, changing of club rules and external audit of the books to name but a few.

In order to make the dream a reality the members also voted at the EGM to impose a compulsory £60 bond across the voting membership, it was necessary to be compulsory so that we were assured of a sum of money to keep the club running.

The figure required was £36000 but with additional voluntary contributions some of which were several thousand pounds we achieved just over £47000. Unfortunately we did lose 13 of the membership who refused to pay the bond even after reminder correspondence. In addition three members also resigned but did say they would have been resigning in January anyway.

We have found a member with family who will be moving in on the 1st January.

When the numbers started dropping the event was scaled down to a smaller more affordable venue, but it now appears we can't cover costs despite this. We have attempted to reinvigorate the event by having a change to another hall but this came at a much higher cost, which members seem unwilling to pay in order to cover the price tag that comes with it, consequently creating a big loss.


By pulling the plug on this years event losses were kept to £300 which was the cancellation charges of the hall and band.
