New Club Bye-Laws

As agreed by the Management Committee (6/4/19)

The Sailing Committee presented a couple of bye-laws that they wished to introduce into the clubs constitution. After some discussion at the Management Committee meeting of the 6th April, it was formally agreed to adopt them. They will now become bye-laws until the next Annual General meeting, when they will be put before the membership.

Please see the additional bye-laws below:

Outboard Motor Storage

The maximum size of an engine in the store shall be width = 320mm [includes the handle] & length 1M.

Support Boat Drivers Minimum age.

The minimum age for a Support Boat Driver is 16 years and must have a Power Boat 2 certificate and preferably have a 1st Aid certificate.

However the Crew MUST be 18 years of age or above and preferably have a 1st Aid Certificate


Members can now see their own profile when logging into the website.





